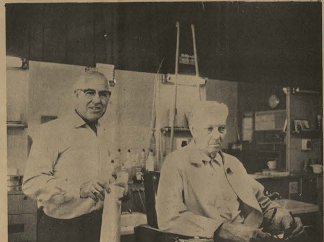

## First Baptist Church News

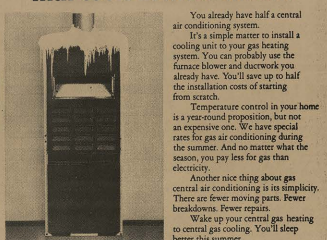
