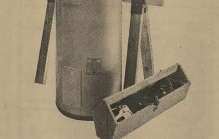

### Communication System Grant Is Approved For Grayson County

A Texas Criminal Justice Council grant of \$150,000 was approved by Gov. Preston Smith at Austin Friday for the Texas Regional Planning Commission. The money will be used to purchase improved police communication equipment in Grayson, Fannin and Collier counties, according to Jerry Chism, executive director of the TRPC.

Grants totaling \$245,000 were approved for 21 regional counties. The Texas Criminal Justice Council received the grant.

The grant money will be used to provide 75 per cent of the cost of high frequency radio equipment for all the police agencies for the three counties, Chism said.

The Planning Commission has been authorized to act as the purchasing agent for the equipment. The grant will be used to purchase improved police communication equipment in Grayson, Fannin and Collier counties, according to Jerry Chism, executive director of the TRPC.

The Texas grant will be used to improve police communication projects outlined in previous TRPC reports. The grant will be used to purchase 75 per cent of the cost of high frequency radio equipment for all the police agencies for the three counties, Chism said.

Major emphasis is expected to be placed during the year on a law enforcement communications system and a regional youth services program.

### THE FAMILY LAWYER

Paupered Pedestrians

Trampled abnormally along the sidewalk, George failed to see a car backing down a driveway. Heard the sidewalk in the path of the car and was injured. He had no time to react before the motorist for damage, blaming for the accident, a sidewalk without looking.

But it wasn't looking, but neither was he. It was negligent, he said.

However, the court found no negligence on George's part and granted his claim. The judge said:

"It is the common experience of first husband to become interested in thought and obligation to see all surroundings when traveling in a place of known safety. Therein lies no want of ordinary care."

Not every court is so lenient of a pedestrian's day-dreaming. But it is true that the law, by and large, looks kindly on the pedestrian. It does not expect the same level of alertness from him as demands from the motorist.

Now are motorists the only ones who must keep a lookout for the pedestrian's safety. For example:

A baseball team was held liable when a house was struck a fence and struck a passing pedestrian on the head. And the owner of a building was held liable when a loose brick fell from the parapet and landed on a pedestrian.

Still, even a pedestrian may sometimes be found guilty of negligence. A woman shopper, struck in a store aisle, sued when her belt caught in a large rack in some aisleway. Clinging to the rack, she was thrown into the aisleway.

Compensation from the city, she charged the sidewalk, but the judge in an unusual decision, but she admitted that she had seen the brick in time to step over it. To the court, this meant that the brick was simply in the path of her step. Dismissing the case, the judge said she had no time to blame her.
