## Post Offices To Host Public July 1

The following announcement was issued from the office of Howe Postmaster James L. Davis this week:

"The inauguration of the new United States Postal Service on July 1, will be celebrated in Washington D.C., and in every post office across the country. Postmaster Davis has announced that all members of the community are invited to visit their local post office on July 1 and enjoy the hospitality of the men and women who comprise the new U.S. Postal Service."

"Dedication ceremonies in Washington will be hosted by Postmaster General Blount. Honored guests will include members of Congress, former Postmasters General, and other dignitaries."

"Visitors to the Howe Post Office will be given a souvenir envelope imprinted with the old and new insignia of the Postal Service. This envelope will also be made available in limited numbers as a first day cancellation for just the cost of an eight cent stamp."

"This will be a good opportunity for every one to see the inside of their Post Office and learn how the mail is handled, concluded Davis.

## Sales Tax Hike In Effect Today

Howe citizens will join the rest of the state in paying an additional one-cent sales tax on most purchases, beginning today (July 1). The increase will boost the tax to five cents here and in other towns which have the one-cent sales tax.

In addition, the cost of moving traffic violations and other convictions will go up under a bill signed into law and designed to provide funds for projects to improve the criminal justice system.

In addition to other taxable court costs, \$2.50 will be charged in each misdemeanor conviction in justice of the peace or municipal court. County misdemeanor convictions will be charged an additional \$3.00 in court costs, and TFCF convictions, \$10.00

## GRAYSON, FANNIN ELIGIBLE FOR FEDERAL GRANTS-PUBLIC WORKS

Formation of an Economic Development district with Fannin County will make Grayson County public works projects eligible for 60 percent federal grants, 50 official and others learned at a Friday meeting in Sherman.

Marvin Haezemer of the EDAI district office in Atlanta conducted the meeting after an introduction by Mike Allen representing Cong. Ray Roberts who efforts resulted in the session for businessmen and public officials.

Henry Troell, business loans; Norris Willis, public works; and G. Chappell, planning, were on hand from the Austin EDA office and talked about their particular fields, answering questions and staying after the meeting to confer with bankers and others who had specific questions to ask in their fields.

Hagamer told the group that he brought a "left handed greeting," since designation of Grayson County as an economic development area means it is not growing at the same rate as the remainder of the country.

However, he said the EDA has services and a system which will help overcome favors resulting from closing of Terris Field.

However, he said the EDA likes to think that the assistance offered goes beyond the regular bureau operations.

Troell outlined ways which EDA loans can be used to finance up to 65 percent of an industry locating a plant in Grayson County. He said that loans less than \$30,000 are referred to the Small Business Administration and cited several multi-million dollar loans made to major firms.

## THE FAMILY LAWYER

### Profit on Your Home?

Every five years, assuming you are an Average American, you will give up one residence and move to another. If this includes selling your home, and if you make a profit, do you have to pay income tax on the amount of the profit?

Generally, no—provided that you buy another home within one year. The Federal government will usually allow you a tax deduction on the theory that the sale is not an ordinary business and a matter of personal necessity.

In order to qualify for the tax deduction, you must fully recoup the cost of the house sold. For example, your new house must be not only bought but also sold. If you do not sell it, you cannot deduct the loss.

In one case, a man who had bought a house in 1964 and sold it in 1965, was held liable for a considerable fine, and the tax was not allowed.

Nevertheless, he tried to get a refund by arguing that at least his intentions were clear by the time of the sale.

But a court ruled him down. The judge said the law had been set on what a person intended to do at the time of the sale.

In another case, a man failed to get a second house within the year solely because of a sudden illness. Was this an acceptable excuse? Again, a court said no. The court said the law is unambiguous and leaves no room for interpretation because of unforeseen circumstances.

What are you intending to do? Are you adding to build a new house, instead of buying one already in existence? Or do you plan to buy a second house within the year, but actual work on the house has not yet begun? Has the second construction already started? Or are you planning to vacate the house?
