Vote registration of 18 year olds slow

There has been no rush of teenagers just turned 18 to register for voting in 1971 elections, according to Grayson Collector George Schumacher. However, two youths have taken advantage of the new situation to qualify for voting.

Benne Joe Thornhill of Howe and Joe Tooley of Van Alstyne.

There is no way of knowing just how many 18, 19 and 20-year-olds registered during the regular period, Schumacher said, as they are listed right in with the others on the poll lists.

Those turning 18 since registration close can qualify for the 1971 elections at Schumacher's courthouse office with their registration effective for any election held at least

30 days after they register. This is the same procedure followed on 21-year-olds under previous laws.

Originally, those in the 18, 19 and 20 bracket were registered because they could vote in federal elections. However, completion of the U. S. Constitution amendment procedure was made it the law of the land and qualified voters of those ages for federal, state, county, city, or any other political subdivision election.

That means that the 18 through 20 residents who are registered can ballot on the Grayson highway right-of-way bond election. Whether or not they make property-owning taxpayers is being checked out by the county in light of recent Supreme Court decisions.

Secure load law to be enforced

Department of Public Safety officials will soon begin to enforce what they call the first secure load law ever passed in Texas.

HB-759, recently signed by Governor Preston Smith, applies to motor vehicles hauling "loose materials" such as dirt, sand, gravel, wood chips, or other material which can fall out or blow out of the trailer, a result of movement, exposure to the air, wind currents, or the weather.

This does not include agricultural products in their natural state.

Officers say they will have a strict enforcement policy and are in the process of informing the public about the law.

At first, there will be warning tickets issued, but more uniform enforcement will come later, they say. The law states that the load carrying the load must be completely enclosed on both sides by sideboards on panels, on a front by a board, or panel or the cab of the vehicle, and on the rear by a tailgate, panel or board.

The load top making contact with any sideboard, side panel or front or rear part of the enclosure will not be within six inches of the top of the enclosure.

The highest part of the load must not be above any point on a plane equal in height to the top of the side, front or rear part of the enclosure that is the least in height, or in the alternative by covering the bed with a canvas, or similar type of firmly secured covering.

The first conviction after violation is subject to a fine of not less than \$25 and not more than \$50, on the second conviction, the punishment shall be not less than \$200 fine.

It also applies to any persons, co-partnership, association, corporation, state, county, municipality, town, village or city department, or other governmental agency.

Strange things are happening

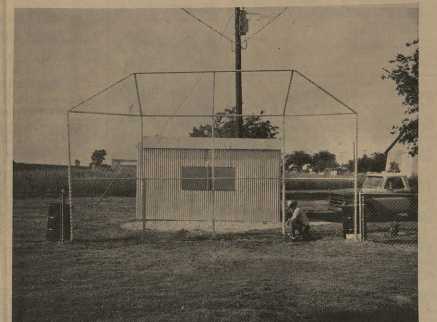

Agree Control Checks Mailed to Grayson Farmers

SHERMAN -- Approximately 1,400 checks totaling \$36,315 are being mailed to Grayson county farmers for participation in the 1971 Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation program, according to J. C. Maples, Grayson ASC committee chairman.

In addition, there are still 139 farms in the county which can qualify for payments if they certify their acreage at the Grayson ASC office on or before July 15. These are producers who signed up for the program earlier but have not certified acreage.

In addition, there is a possibility of another payment on wheat in December. Wheat, feed grain and cotton are involved in the ASC program.

Participants in the voluntary programs set aside a portion of their productive cropland to help reduce excess production, contributing to economic stability and making them eligible for federal payments. The Grayson county office received checks for 1,410 participating farms from the New Orleans center, and to date some 700 have been signed and mailed to producers.

Maples said all farmers can expect to receive preliminary payments by the end of July.

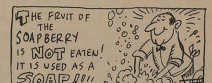

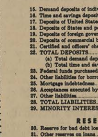

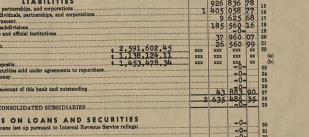
