For each additional family member, add \$480 per year to the income level. Families falling within these scales or those suffering from unusual circumstances or hard ships are urged to apply for free or reduced price lunches for their children. They may do so by filling in application forms sent in a letter to par-ents. Additional copies are afice in each school. The infor-mation provided on the appli cation will be confidential and will be used only for the pur pose of determining epicibility

Under provisions of the policy the superintendent will review applications and deter mine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the superintendent, he may make a request either orally appeal the decision. Dr. Ned Culp, president of the Howe
