

*** WHAT THE BONDS WILL MEAN TO GRAYSON COUNTY ***

- 1. \$4,000.000 in Bonds will bring nearly \$75,000,000 highway construction.
- 2. Large percentage of \$75,000,000 would go into Grayson County economy through wages, materials purchased, equipment fuel and repairs, and other purchases locally.
- 3. Industry, in most cases, requires or prefers location on controlled access highways. Grayson County is now limited in both large and small industrial tracts on controlled access highways. Better, safer highways give employees quicker, easier, safer routes to jobs, - letting employees live in one part of the county and work in another.
- 4. Hundreds of thousands of dollars paid in gasoline taxes in Grayson County are going for highway construction in other parts of Texas because Grayson County cannot provide right-of-way.
- 5. Safer, better highways will not eliminate accidents, but new and improved highways, through better design, can reduce accidents. From 1961 to 1970 auto accidents on Grayson County Highways took 172 lives, with injuries in the hundreds, and property damage in the millions of dollars. - 6. It has been fourteen years, since Grayson County voters last voted right-ofway bonds. A highway construction program can not begin, without new bonds for right-of-way. Bonds will be sold only as the program develops, and not more than 4 cents tax per \$100 assessed value would be required in the foreseeable future.
