TP&L to apply for rate increase

Charles H. Parkman, Texas Power & Light Company manager, today stated an application will be filed with the

City of Howe for a six per cent general rate merease in TP&L's electric bills within the next few days.

The rate increase, first for TP&L in 20 years, will be considered at the next Council meeting, Thursday, January . Rate increases granted by city officials are, according to Parkman, subject also to review by President Nixon's Price Commission.

Due to decreases in rates and increases in average use, Parkman said, the average cost per unit of energy used by residential customers of TP&L would, after the proposed increase, still be lower

than it was in 1966. The manager said that the rate increase was necessary for the Company to maintain rate of return sufficient to finance large investments in facilities required to meet the growing demands for energy in the area served by Texas

Power & Light Company. He added that a projection of the Company's business for the next three years indicated the need for a much larger increase, but the Company, in keeping with current national policy, was requesting only six per cent.
