She will be associate professor of English.

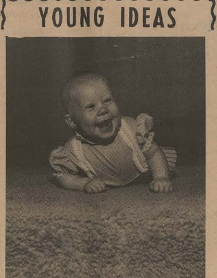
Dr. Woods is married to John C. Woods, formerly of Whiteboro. They have two children.

The "key" law

Did you leave your keys in your car when you parked it?

If you forget this little chore you are breaking the law and could be fined up to \$200!

This is just one of the little items passed by the legislature and it went into effect around the first of September.

Perhaps the "key law" will serve to deter some youngsters from picking up a car for a joy ride, but we doubt it will do much to stop professional thieves from stealing. Car owners concerned with the safety of their car should lock them, but that is sort of goes against the grain to be told that the car owner who leaves the keys in his car is the culprit and not the fellow who wanders by and decides to drive off in something that doesn't belong to him.

Need we suppose there will be a law to leave your home unlocked while in the back yard mowing the yard and thus be guilty of contributing to the delinquency of a thievery-minded individual who might wander by.

Then perhaps we will see a law enacted to require people to lock up valuables in a safe and anchor their TV to the wall with a chain.

Social Security

People working in shops or private homes are covered by social security. Gas taxes social security manager for Sherman says coverage of domestic workers is a little different than coverage of regular industrial or business employees. Close family relations are effectively excluded and the wages paid must be \$30 or more a quarter from each employer to be covered. Just as business, the employed must report to Internal Revenue the wages received of each employer at the end of each calendar quarter. We are just finishing up the third calendar quarter with September. Wages paid in July, August and September are to be reported in October. The third change under the new laws allow the county tax collector - assuming no dispute persists to write registrations. The county tax collector has industrial groups and organizations where an applicant can be obtained to take care of all of his customers," said Schumaker. At the same time, the county tax laws will be changed for the first time in many years. Under the new law, voter registration will be in the form of a bill, full and complete, returned to the voter to carry for the next three years, Schumaker added.

New Voter Registration Law In Effect In County

SHIMMAN - Voters started drastically changing the 40th legislature George Schumaker said today.

"We had the first flurry of voters come in last Friday when the new program went into effect," said Schumaker. "Under the new regulations, 18 to 21 year - old voters can register now for city, county and state elections."

"They must live in the state a year, the county six months and within precinct 30 days to be eligible," he said. "However, when the laws take effect, any voter who was already registered at the time of the change."

EXEMPTIONS NOTED
"If they have lived in the location only a few weeks or 30 or 60 days, they can register with an exception because of the voter qualities. For example, if a person had lived in the area just a month, he could register now and the exception would be he or she would be eligible to vote. In 1972, Schumaker explained. Under the new voter laws, voters can register at any time during the year and not just during January, but the registration is good for three years. However, to keep the registration valid, ballots must vote in at least one election annually, Schumaker said.

"When the new laws should a person move to a new address, then this change must be heard at the county tax office so the voter rolls can be kept up to date."
