TP&L to apply for rate increase

Charles H. Parkman, Texas Power & Light Company manager, today stated an application will be filed with the City of Howe for a six per cent general rate increase in TP&L's electric bills within the next few days.

The rate increase, first for TP&L in 20 years, will be considered at the next Council meeting, Thursday, January 6. Rate increases granted by city officials are, according to Parkman, subject also to review by President Nixon's Price Commission.

Due to decreases in rates and increases in average use, Parkman said, the average cost per unit of energy used by residential customers of TP&L would, after the proposed increase, still be lower than it was in 1966.

The manager said that the rate increase was necessary for the Company to maintain a rate of return sufficient to finance large investments in facilities required to meet the growing demands for energy in the area served by Texas Power & Light Company.

He added that a projection of the Company's business for the next three years indicated the need for a much larger increase, but the Company, in keeping with current national policy, was requesting only six per cent.

Plans furthered for Dorchester water system

Preliminary plans for Dorchester's proposed new water system were completed when city council met for the regular December business meeting.

Engineer for the new system said total cost of the project would be approximately \$173,000.

Minimum bill for service was estimated at \$8.50 for the first 3,000 gallons, with the rate declining sharply for the next 3,000 gallons to 90 cents per thousand. Larger quantities would be at even lower rates, a spokesman added.

Preliminary plans have already been submitted to the FFA for approval, with operation of the present system assumed by the city January 1, 1972.

Council set a deadline of January 1 for accepting deposits at the 370 rate.

Mayor L. M. Harmon said three options are available for those desiring to participate in the new system. Deposits paid by January 1 will be \$70; or a deposit of \$15 may be made by January 1, with three monthly payments of \$30 each for a total of \$75; or those participating in the system after January 1 will have to pay \$140.

Third quarter sales tax receipts down

Third quarter city sales tax receipts for the third quarter of 1971 were down slightly from the previous quarter, city records show. Receipts for the quarter, July, August and September, totaled \$2,263.74, compared to \$2,877.65 for the second quarter. April, May and June, first quarter receipts were \$1,740.84.

Caldwell appointed to Texas Rangers

A former Howe man, H. K. Caldwell, 56, has been appointed a member of the Texas Rangers following his recent retirement after a quarter of a century of service in the Texas Department of Public Safety as a patrolman.

Now a resident of Texarkana, Caldwell served as a patrolman supervising the motor vehicle inspection program in the Sherman area for 16 years while living in Howe. He had served in a similar capacity at Texarkana for three months

Building permits set new record

Howe building permits for 1971 set an all-time record, city hall records revealed this week. Permits for the year totaled \$1,589,700.

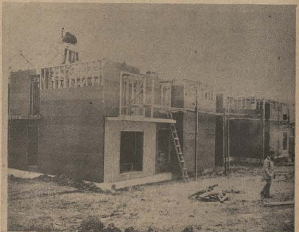
Permit fees collected by the city for the permits was \$790,773.

Largest permit issued was for \$1,000,000 to Swanner and Reed, Developers, for construction of a 100-unit apartment complex in Western Hills which is currently under construction. Completion date has

been set around September 1. Another permit for \$347,000 was issued for construction of Westgate Mobile Home Park, which opened for business recently in the north part of the city.

Other business permits included the new White Auto Store building and a service station, both in Western Hills.

In recent years, permits for new construction have ranged from \$250,000 to half a million dollars.

BASKETBALL

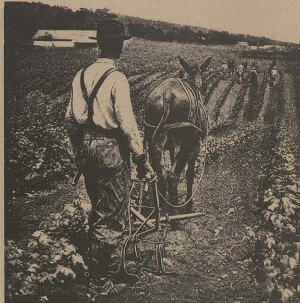


Juniar High boys' basketball team maintained a perfect season record through the holidays winning the final tournament trophy in the finals December 18.

CITY SALES TAXES CLAIMED—More than 450 cities levying local option sales tax are now being received over \$40.3 million from the source during the quarter which ended September 30.

Comptroller Robert S. Caldwell said the take from the tax per cent levy actually was more than \$41 million from which was deducted the state's revenue before the money was returned to the cities.

Major cities, of course, received the largest share of the total. Houston alone got \$1.1 million, Dallas \$2.7 million and San Antonio \$4.4 million.

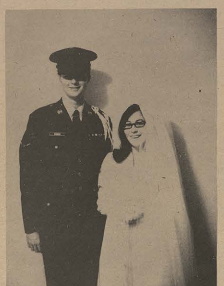
